30 years of the Schengen Agreement

The future of Schengen: challenges and opportunities

The border-free Schengen area provides freedom of movement to more than 400 million EU citizens, as well as to many non-EU nationals, businessmen, tourists and other persons legally present on the EU territory. During the last thirty years, cooperation among individual national governments of Member States of the EU resulted in the Schengen Agreement on the gradual abolition of checks at common borders. At this special occasion, the EMN Conference will focus on where we are today, taking into account the growth of the Schengen area, its rapid changes as well as the challenges and opportunities the EU institutions and Member States have been and are facing.

The Conference is organised by the European Migration Network National Contact Point Luxembourg (LU EMN NCP). It will take place in the Maison du Savoir (Campus Belval: 2, Avenue de l'Université, L-4365, Esch-sur-Alzette, Luxembourg) on **7th October 2015**, starting from 9am. In addition, the Conference will be accompanied by two exhibitions: the photographic project *NoWhere People* and the publication *100% Luxembourg* by Cefis (Centre d'étude et de formation interculturelles et sociales). Simultaneous translation will be provided in English and French.
